	Smoke detectors are on every floor, near bedrooms.	
	Carbon monoxide detector is installed.	
	Batteries are tested monthly for all detectors.	
	Stairways are well lit and clear.	
	Stairways have a gate at each entry.	
	Window blind cords are secure and out of reach of children.	
	All chemicals and unsafe materials are locked or out of reach of children.

Module 2: Setting Up the Outside of Your Home

While watching the module, please use this checklist as a guide to help you better understand the changes you may need to make at your home to ensure a safe and healthy environment for young children.

Please check the items below where you already meet the expectations described in the module. The items you do not check may be areas where you should make changes.

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Outside my home
\square Is in good repair and free of peeling paint.
$\ \square$ All rooms used by children have sufficient ventilation and lighting from the outside.
\square All windows used for ventilation have screens.
$\ \square$ Windows above the first floor have safety guards or can be opened from the top.
$\ \square$ The home's outdoor play space is safe and free of hazards.
$\ \square$ All sandboxes are tightly covered, when not in use.
$\ \square$ Outdoor porches are on the first floor level and they are enclosed with a gate at the entrance.
\square All plants accessible to children are safe.
$\ \square$ Swimming pools have a secure fence, with a locked gate.
$\ \square$ Children are protected from weather, using appropriate clothing and sunscreen.
☐ Drinking water is always available to children.
$\ \square$ A plan is in place for evacuating in case of an emergency, and it is practiced monthly.
$\ \square$ A flashlight and batteries are available.
☐ Everyone in a vehicle is properly restrained, at all times.

Module 3: Daily Routines

My current daily routines include:		
☐ Children are supervised at ALL times.		
$\ \square$ The phone is in working order and available for use.		
$\ \square$ A list of emergency numbers is posted near the phone.		
$\ \square$ A fully stocked first aid kit is available.		
$\hfill \Box$ Children and adults wash their hands at the appropriate times with the appropriate procedure.		
\square The diapering area is away from where food is prepared or eaten.		
$\ \square$ The bathroom is accessible to the children in my care.		
\square During toilet training, children are not encouraged with food as a prize.		
\square All pets are kept in a safe and sanitary manner.		
\square All firearms are stored under lock and key, in a place not accessible to children.		
$\ \square$ All medications are stored in their original containers and out of reach of children.		
$\ \square$ Positive, consistent methods are used to guide children's behavior.		
\square All materials used with the children are age-appropriate and free of hazards.
